New Updates on Major Repair, Modernization and Development in LAUSD

As the second largest school district in the nation, the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) enrolls more than 640,000 students in kindergarten through 12th grade, at over 900 campuses as well as 187 charter schools. Their footprint in the region is spread over 720 square miles and include the mega-city of Los Angeles as well as parts of 31 smaller municipalities plus several unincorporated sections of Southern California.

The Facilities Services Division is responsible for the execution of the District's school construction bond programs, the maintenance and operations of schools, the utilization of existing assets, and master planning for future capital projects. With a \$7 Billion Measure Q Bond Program focusing on upgrading LAUSD's portfolio, Chief Facilities Executive Mr. Mark Hovatter will share LAUSD's goals for the next 5 - 10 years. Mr. Mark Hovatter will also share ongoing and upcoming major LAUSD facilities improvement programs and associated AEC opportunities. With rising utility costs, this program will also feature the steps the District is taking to make their campuses more sustainable and cost efficient.
