The Forest Service offers many exciting opportunities in several different career fields, such as:

FORESTERS



Foresters are experts in managing the growth of different types of trees and other vegetation. They are skilled in caring for trees, while considering how a forest may develop over long time frames. From planting seedlings to inspecting a contractor's work, foresters provide the technical and professional expertise for evaluating the health of our forests. To apply for these positions, individuals need a degree in forestry or related subject-matter with at least 24 semester hours of course work in forestry.

NATURAL RESOURCES SPECIALIST



Natural resources specialists care for our national forests and grasslands. They do a variety of work, including developing forest and environmental plans, evaluating requests and issuing special use permits, using geographic information systems (GIS), and addressing recreation, lands, and wilderness use. Individuals with degrees in biological sciences, agriculture, natural resource management, chemistry, or related disciplines generally qualify for these positions.
